News from the Minister & Congregation of the Unitarian Meeting House, Bridge Street, Framlingham

Dear Friends, The **Eastern Union**, our District Association linking Unitarian congregations in East Anglia, has been suspended from 1st April 2016 for a period of two years following a decision taken by a substantial majority vote at the well-attended Extraordinary General Meeting of the Eastern Union held at the Ipswich Meeting House on Saturday 19 March.

The EGM had been called to consider a proposal from the Cambridge congregation, approved at the District's AGM September 2015, to wind up the Eastern Union. The background to the proposal was the stepping down of Shirley Fieldhouse, who has served faithfully as District Secretary for many years, and the reluctance of people to put their names forward to serve in this role. There has also been a feeling that existing District events rarely attract new people. Shirley was thanked warmly for her many years of service.

The presumption is that the Eastern Union will be wound up at the end of the two year period unless there is a decision to do otherwise. The constitution does allow for calling an Extraordinary General Meeting at the request of four constituent congregations - which gives the freedom for congregations in the region to go forward in any way they wish; whether to confirm that the Eastern Union be wound up or to revive it in a new form.

Ray and Sheila Seal were able to speak to their proposal of appointing a District Co-ordinator to keep traditional District events ticking over but it was felt that those present wanted to take a step back to think further about what could be put in place so no decision was taken on this.

The two year suspension is a constructive compromise put to the meeting by the guest chairman Alan Ruston, thus providing an opportunity for everyone to explore new and different ways of networking the congregations without the pressure to hold AGMs, Executive Meetings, or the usual programme of activities. Alan's suggestion quickly found favour with a clear majority. The EGM was also attended by Robert Ince of our national General Assembly Executive Committee and it was good to have his input.

It is up to us whether the suspension period will be one of stagnation & retrenchment or creative development. Certainly my wish is that we think seriously about how we want congregations in our region to get together and that we experiment a little. Slipping into isolation would be a very negative step.

Here are two completely fresh ideas to be considered: 1) a District retreat (Hucklow?); 2) living in the British region geographically closest to the Netherlands, we make efforts to establish formal links with liberal congregations there. In possible furtherance of this I am hoping to attend the forthcoming *International Council of Unitarians and Universalists* (ICUU) *Conference* (17-23 July): the venue is the *Mennorode Conference Centre*, Elspeet, fairly close to Amsterdam.
